## Call for Artwork Donations

### Overview

Artwork created and donated by Architects will be sold at the AIA Ohio Foundation Silent Auction during the 2003 AIA Ohio Convention in Dayton, Ohio, October 9-11. Prior to the convention and auction these works by AIA Ohio Architects will be on public exhibit at the Kettering Government Center Gallery (near Dayton) along with selected original drawings by internationally famous architects on loan from Ohio State University. The exhibit will then move to Sinclair Center, site of the convention and silent auction. Press releases will promote the exhibit throughout Ohio. All proceeds from the auction go to support the AIA Ohio Foundation.

### Art Donations

AIA Ohio members and associates are invited to donate original two-dimensional artwork for exhibit and auction. Working through your local AIA Chapter art donations will be accepted until July 11, 2003. Your AIA Ohio Director will assist in the delivery of the work at the July 18 AIA Ohio Board meeting. The AIA Ohio Foundation's goal is to exhibit work by architects from across the entire state (5-10 works from each AIA chapter). The exhibit and auction will be limited to 30-40 pieces of art depending on the sizes of work and space limitations of the gallery and exhibit hall. # Technical Submission Requirements

## Acceptable Media

Two-dimensional completed artwork ready for exhibit hanging may include:

Paintings – oil, acrylic, watercolor, pastel or mixed media

Drawings in pencil, ink, charcoal, crayon, pastel or mixed media

Photographs, lithographs, original prints, woodcuts, or other works on paper

## Size

Any size that can be reasonably transported and exhibited is acceptable

Artwork any larger than 36" in any dimension may require special handling

All work must be dimensionally stable

## Framing and matting

Works on paper must be properly matted and framed

Paintings or other works intended to be framed, must be framed

Paintings, if unframed, must have properly finished edges as complete works

Irregularly shaped work must be properly finished for exhibit

All work must have concealed hanging hardware, preferably adjustable

## Content

Content and subject matter are not limited

Architectural content is fully appreciated but not required

Community standards for decency must be respected

## Delivery

Work must be delivered to your local AIA Chapter no later than July 11, 2003

Work will be delivered to AIA Dayton at the July 18, 2003 AIA Ohio Board meeting

Special arrangements if needed can be made for delivery to AIA Dayton

Unsold work will be delivered to the donor or donor's chapter at the convention

## Value

The donor must state the value for insurance and tax deduction purposes

The donor has complete autonomy in setting the value of the donated work

The donor will receive a letter describing and acknowledging the gift

The donor should consult their tax professional regarding tax deductions

Each art donor will also receive a special AIA gift of appreciation

The values will be used in the auction brochure and the bid sheet

The values will not be used as starting amounts for bids

The value of donations is recommended to range from \$50 to \$1000

The AIA Foundation reserves the right to exclude work based on availability exhibit space

Every attempt will be made to include a broad representation of Ohio Architects

Work not conforming to the above professional gallery standards will be returned
